

### 1. SOUK KITCHEN *Momo at the Souks, Beirut*

Following on from the celebrated Momo and Sketch venues in London, and Paris' playful hang-out Le Derrière, Algerian-born restaurateur Mourad Mazouz has recently opened Momo at the Souks in Beirut. Expertly fusing the traditional and the modern to evoke the Arabic Mediterranean flavour of the city, he enlisted the help of Annabel Karim Kassar and Violaine Jantet to create a fun, multi-coloured space filled with vintage furniture, designer pieces and an art installation by Mehrnoosh Khadivi. Located in the heart of Beirut, above the jewellery market, the restaurant couldn't have a better location, overlooking the city's souks and rooftops.

### 2. MUST DO ZETTER *Zetter Townhouse, London*

The Zetter Hotel has launched a charming, next-door 13-bedroom hotel set in a Georgian townhouse overlooking St John's Square. In the vintage-inspired cocktail lounge, hosted by Tony Conigliaro and Camille Hobby-Limon from 69 Colebrooke Row, a hip crowd sip rhubarb Kir Royal or Nettle Gimlet, with gin and homemade nettle cordial – good with the sardines on toast. Of the rooms, the ample Townhouse Apartment offers space for an after-party, or cosy up in a small but cute Townhouse Club room. ### 3. BEST CELLAR *Atrio, Cáceres*

Located in the historical centre of Cáceres, a Unesco World Heritage site, the Relais & Chateaux hotel and two Michelin-star restaurant Atrio may present a traditional stone exterior, but inside, a contemporary installation by architects Mansilla and Tuñón brings the 14-room hotel right up to date. ### 4. HOT SHOT *The Chandelier, Las Vegas*

Fittingly for bling-tastic Las Vegas, crystals seem literally to drip from the roof of The Chandelier bar. Housed inside The Cosmopolitan hotel, it comprises three levels – one actually encased in a giant chandelier – each with a different mood and cocktail menu.
